Summary: Within the scope of your ASME Journals subscription your university researchers can publish their articles as open access in ASME Hybrid journals in the types of publications covered by the agreement without paying APC (Article Processing Charge).



Important Details:

- The agreement covers ASME Open Journal of Engineering and 35 Hybrid Journals.
- Institutional e-mail address must be used.
- The author should submit article via [ASME's Journal Tool](#) using the university's domain name. This domain name allows correspondence and updates regarding the author's article to be forwarded and allows the APC to be removed.
- When the article is accepted, the Journal Tool includes a clear statement indicating whether there is a transformative agreement with the author's university. If there is such an agreement, the author must choose the Open Access option, and the fees will be waived.
