DATA CITE DOI COSTS:

Calculating the cost for repositories to mint DOIs and to participate in the DataCite Consortium was widely discussed amongst the community.

ALMA & PRIMO REMOVE OPENAIRE

Concern was raised when it was discovered that OpenAIRE had been removed from the Alma/Primo Central Discovery Index. Repository managers contacted Ex Libris to voice their concerns. OpenAIRE currently addressing this issue with Ex Libris.

OPENAIRE COMPLIANCE ADAPTOR

Institutions were contacted and asked by the ORI convenors to provide an update on their status regarding preparation for the OpenAIRE Compliance Adaptor.

RORs IN REPOSITORIES

Advice was shared amongst the community on the using ROR persistent identifiers in the context of repositories.

ORI COMMUNITY MEETING

A community meeting was held on the 14th of October 202. During the meeting Sinéad Keogh and Caleb Dervan provided a presentation on the University of Limerick's experience moving from Figshare to DSpace. The meeting was chaired by Cillian Joy, who provided updates on the ORI, also discussed at the meeting was:
